

CS302 Programming Assignment Guidelines

- (1) **Email Subject Line:** Include the name of the course, “CS302”, in the subject of your emails. Preferably, also include a brief description. For instance, a subject such as “CS302 HW1 Question” or “CS302 Assignment 2 Submission” will help ensure that your email is not lost.

- (2) **Submit Attachments:**

Send your files as attachments. Do not paste code into the body of the email.

- (3) **Deadlines:**

Only the most recent work that is received before the posted deadline will be graded.

- (4) **Identifying Files:**

Include your last name and first initial in your filenames. For example, I might name my files `BangL_hw1_main.cpp` and `BangL_hw1_functions.h`. Also, comment your name, the date, the name of the class, and the assignment number at the top of your files.

- (5) **Multiple Files:**

Some prefer to write all their code in one big file. On the other hand, some prefer to put all their important subroutines into header files. Use your best judgement, and inform me of any helpful details (see item 7).

- (6) **Input / Output:**

Unless the assignment says otherwise, input and output are up to you. You can use file streaming or file redirection, as long as you let me know how your code should run (see item 7).

- (7) **(Optional) Information File:**

If your program requires special instructions please include a plain text information file, such as `BangL_hw1Info.txt`. This is useful to let me know if I need to compile your files in a certain order, if your program has a known bug in it, if I need to use file redirection to read input, or any other information that will help me run your code.
